### A general guide to entry requirements

<ul> <li>Centres require a range of GCSEs including maths and English. (example 5 grades 9-5)</li> <li>Some subjects need specific subjects and grades (example Science &amp; Maths grade 7 at GCSE – English &amp; History grade 6)</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>≻ Minimum of 5 grade 4 GCSEs including maths and English.</li> <li>≻ Some require GCSE grade 4 or above in specific subjects</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Minimum of 4 GCSEs at grade 4 or above (or vocational equivalent) usually including maths and/or English</li> <li>Some require 5 GCSEs grade 4</li> <li>Some require specific subjects</li> </ul>
GCSE	Technical Vocational	Applied general Level 2 (BTEC)
<ul> <li>Minimum of 3 grade 4 GCSEs including maths and English.</li> <li>Some subjects need specific subjects and grades</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>➤ You start most courses at Level 1, progressing to Level 2 and Level 3 as your skills develop</li> <li>➤ For some courses you can enter at Level 2 or 3 depending on skill level</li> <li>➤ Some courses need specific subjects</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Minimum of 3 GCSEs at grade 3 (or vocational equivalent) usually including maths and/or English</li> <li>Some require specific subjects</li> </ul>

### What do qualifications lead to?

Qualification	Leads to
A Level	University/college, higher and degree apprenticeships, work
TLevel	University/college, higher and degree apprenticeships, work
Technical/Vocational	Apprenticeship, work, college or university
Applied	University/college, apprenticeship, work
Traineeship	Apprenticeship, further education, work
Apprenticeship	Apprenticeship, further education, work

#### T Levels – what are they?

Technical levels are new qualifications, examined nationally for the first time in 2022

- They are:
- $\blacktriangleright$  > Equivalent to 3 'A' Level qualifications
- Directly linked to future employment through higher apprenticeships or straight into employment
- More hands on than academic qualifications They consist of:
- Scenario based teaching
- $\rightarrow$  3 months of work placement
- Learning employability skills (specific and general)
- Different assessment styles (not just exam based)




